When ice melts, what does it become?

Years ago, I heard about an incident that involved the national testing of young children in Japan. The parents of a girl in the second or third grade argued that the response given by their daughter to one of the questions should not have been marked incorrect. The question was, "When ice melts, what does it become?" If we only considered the physical properties of ice, we would quickly conclude that, "When ice melts, it becomes water."

This young girl wrote something I felt was most beautiful. In fact, her response was in essence the Buddha-Dharma. She wrote, "When ice melts, it becomes spring." In her experience, she saw that when the ice melts, the whole world is changing into a new season. We cannot help but smile and nod our heads in agreement at the natural truth revealed in her answer.

Although she did not receive credit for her response, it caused a wave of concern throughout the Japanese educational system, causing teachers to reconsider the content for their lessons. And although her answer was marked incorrect, to me, this young girl was truly looking at the world with wonderful Dharma-eyes.

As we enjoy the coming of spring this month, let us also open our Dharma-eyes and see clearly the undeniable reality that truly everything is changing. "When ice melts . . . it becomes spring." This spring of 2006 will never come again. Let me try to live each day with deep Nembutsu Gratitude.
