Shinran Shonin's 750th Memorial Slogan and logo

For the Shinran Shonin's 750th Memorial, the Hongwanji has recently selected its slogan and logo to commemorate the observance which will take place in 2011. It is our hope that they will be used for publications such as temple newsletters and flyers so that people in your district will become familiar with the forthcoming important observance.

Slogan: 世のなか安穏なれ (Yono naka annon nare)

On April 27, 2006, Governor General Kosho Fujikawa, at a press conference, revealed the slogan as shown above which literally means "May peace and tranquility prevail throughout the world." The following is his statement:

"This phrase was written by Shinran Shonin, who lived through social turmoil of medieval Japan, to indicate the path which Nembutsu practitioners should follow.

Each and every one of us, who lives in this contemporary society, is exposed to the crisis of war, various events which show little or no concern to life, and lack moral sense. Therefore, we must reflect on our own self-centered minds and become aware of the importance of the lives of others. In the way of self-righteous thinking that I am right and others are wrong, true peace will never be realized.

Only the Buddha's Wisdom is able to break through our prejudice standing to obstinate the dualism of right and wrong, solving the antagonism of human beings. It was Shinran Shonin's wish to let the Buddha's teaching spread and peace and tranquility prevail in the world. Hence, in response to his wish, we have selected this slogan for the Memorial.

The Hongwanji

“Kokoro no Sentaku”

I was reading one of articles, and Rev. Akio Miyaji, who is the resident minister at Orange County Buddhist Temple in Buddhist Churches of America, explained the reason why we come to Buddhist service.

He stated that most of us, we take a bath or shower every day. We sometimes do so morning and night. How many would consider it acceptable to go a week without washing. I think not very many. Instead, we try to keep ourselves physically as clean as we can. We use soap and shampoo, and with soap and suds we try to scrub and clean ourselves from the top of our heads to the tips of our toes. It feels good to have that squeaky clean feeling.

However, Miyaji-Sensei said, in coming to service each week; in coming into the beautiful Hondo and sitting quietly and listening to the Dharma. He called this, "*Kokoro no Sentaku*." *Sentaku* is the Japanese word that means "to clean", and *Kokoro* is the expression for "heart and mind."

What Sensei was saying was that we come to a temple to wash and clean our *Kokoro*. "*Kokoro no Sentaku*" also means to try to clean our hearts of any anger and complaints of any worry or regrets. It is impossible to have even the smallest and tiniest feeling of appreciation for anything when we are angry or complaining.

While we sit in the Hondo, we try to simply remember again what is truly of value in life. And with this awareness, try to live and appreciate of the moment that is NOW.

This is the mind aspect of the word "*Kokoro*." So not only do we come to each service to clean our hearts. We come also to clear our minds of our busy schedules and agendas and try to only be right here in the moment that is now.

Something is so hard to do when we often feel emotionally and mentally stretched with too few hours in the day to complete the many things on our daily "to do" list. But "*Kokoro no Sentaku*" is to try to clear our minds and our hearts and simply be in the here and now. The Buddha would say, "WAKE UP!", "Open your eyes to the Moment." "Let go of Anger and Selfish Complaints." "This Day this Moment does not come again."

If we live just filling our time with activity doing as much as we can, then each day becomes a blur and when we look back, there is little you remember. With the schedules, we keep now-a-days; it's hard to live appreciating the ever passing moment. But when we do, I think something special happens.

"Kokoro no Sentaku", this is why we come to the temple.

May 13/14 weekend was a very pleasant and happy one as Calgary Sangha celebrated 50th Anniversary with the weather co-operating. There was Open House and reunion at the temple and Banquet Dinner at Blackfoot Inn on Saturday and then Chigo procession and Commemoration Service at the temple on Sunday. A few surviving chartered members and Rev.& Mrs. Kyojo Ikuta were acknowledged before the guest minister Sasaki Sensei's Dharma Talk.

BCC president and myself attended World Jodo Shinshu Coordinating Council on May 25/26 in Kyoto. Mr. J. Hisanaga who visited Japan for the first time seemed to have enjoyed Kyoto as well as meeting other delegates from Brazil, Hawaii, and BCA. The roof of Founder's Hall was completed and as the cover being taken down, you can see the new roof next year, although the inner restoration has to be done for a few more years before Shinran Shonin's 750th Memorial Service in 2011-12. The entire budget of the service will be 260 million dollars.

Recollection as BCC minister

As I have been a minister for many years, I have encountered with many presidents across Canada. Generally speaking, temple president is expected to be a dedicated Buddhist as well as showing leadership in the administration of the Sangha. And also he/she has to assist resident minister who can work comfortably in the missionary activities.

As far as I remember, Mr. Masao Terakita was a great president at Lethbridge Buddhist Church during my tenure in 1968-70. He was the first person to open the temple door and most likely the last one to close it. He attended all the Sunday services as well as fundraising activities. He was always a top donor and supporter of the temple. Whenever we had guest ministers for special occasions, he and his wife volunteered to entertain them and offered accommodations.

One Sunday morning I woke up to find a huge amount of snow outside and I thought there would be no service for the day. After breakfast, however, I noticed someone working hard to clear the snow on the driveway. It was the president with his bald head steaming by shovelling the snow. I went out to assist him to finish the work. I really appreciated his kindness when his wife told me later that he had got up dark and early to clear his own driveway before coming over to my residence. I found out people in Alberta got used to the big snow, so they eventually can manage themselves to come to Sunday Service on time.

At any rate, I hope the resident minister is the spiritual leader and the president and the board can assist him/her in the missionary activities. In gassho, namoamidabutsu...
